

BRETRY HALL

LOCATION: Bretby Hall, Bretby, Derbyshire

PROJECT: Full restoration and conversion into luxury apartments

PROJECT LENGTH: 2 Years

INFORMATION: Bretby Hall is a grade 2 Star listed building set in its own park land close to the village of Bretby. The former home of Lord Carnarvon who famously discovered the tomb of Tutankhamen with Howard Carter in 1922. Bretby hall had been used as a hospital until falling derelict in the 1970's

Mike Kemp project managed the internal restoration, converting into luxury apartments. The external works involved a full roof restoration including the replacement of all sand cast lead, stone repairs to all facades and restoration of all existing windows. Working with Architects Brownhill Hayward Brown of Lichfield, English Heritage and the Conservation officer the Abbey was restored to its former glory.
